
DMMMSU helps revitalize Salt Industry in Cagayan Province

The first skills training on Solar Sea Salt Making was held at Ballesteros, Cagayan on July 3-4, 2023. Dr. Andie John D. The MOA sets the stage for future joint projects, research endeavors, and professional development programs for both institutions.




BFAR awards scholars with distinct honors


Science teachers from the secondary schools of the division who were able to register through a first-come, firstserved online registration were considered participants in all the four series exclusively.

The Biological and Physical Sciences Department of the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Graduate Studies of the South La Union Campus implemented the Series 2 of the Bioliteracy Training Program for science educators in Region 1.

Held on June 1 and 2, 2023, the twoday activity featured lectures on topics such as measurements, mother-tongue-based approaches, lenses and holograms, and electricity and Al. Ms. Nescy Leann F. Galban, Mr. Ronnie R. Ringor, and Prof. Dan Vergel M. Masiong, delivered these engaging sessions while Dr. Maria Cristina B. Bandarlipe, the Program Chair for BS Biology, prepared the training design. Moreover, Dr. Frederick Tadifa, Mr. Markdale Olarte, Dr. Glennadi Rualo, Ms. Beatriz Aspiras, Dr. Precelita Osillos, and Ms. Vinya Argame served as facilitators.

Under the guidance of Dr. Mary Corinne R. Selga and Dr. Maria Cristina B. Bandarlipe, the Program was born out of a conversation with Ms. Anna Mae Lee, a student in the College of Graduate Studies, who highlighted the importance of expert-led training for teachers in conducting science investigation projects. With a focus on biology, chemistry, and physics instruction, it aims to equip science educators by Maria Cristina B. Bandarlipe

with updated knowledge, pedagogies, and assessment tools relevant to today's educational landscape.

The Program's inaugural series which was held on December 2–3, 2022 brought together 43 science and non-science teachers. Resource speakers including Dr. Precelita L. Osillos, Dr. Mary Corinne R. Selga, Mr. John Raymund D. Torres, Dr. Maria Cristina B. Bandarlipe, and Dr. Flordiliza B. Dalumay, shared their expertise during the workshop.

Before the implementation of the

training, the Department conducted a needs assessment survey among science educators in the region and the Commission on Diocesan Schools. The survey results reinforced the demand for improved training opportunities. As a result, a memorandum of agreement was signed between DMMMSU and the Commission on Diocesan Schools, under the supervision of CDS Superintendent, Dr. Everlita D. Nones. Looking ahead, Series 3, which focuses on biology and chemistry, is scheduled for July 12-14, 2023. This final installment will mark the conclusion of the Bioliteracy Training.
